Review Prepositions of Place AT, IN, ON

In general, we use:

- •at for a POINT, INSTITUTIONS
- •in for a WIDE FLAT AREA, an ENCLOSED SPACE/INSIDE A BOX, a GEOGRAPHICAL REGIONS
- •on for a LINE, a HORIZON, a VERTICAL SURFACE, a PUBLIC TRANSPORT

Look at these examples:

- •My plane stopped at Dubai and Hanoi and arrived in Bangkok two hours late.
- •When will you arrive at the office?
- •Do you work in an office?
- •Jupiter is in the Solar System.
- •You are standing **on** my foot.
- •I live on the seventh floor at 21 Oxford Street in London.

Notice the use of the prepositions of place at, in, and on in these standard expressions:

POINT	ENCLOSED	SURFACE
USE AT	SPACE USE IN	USE ON

I made a list with the most common expressions for you to take a look at, whenever you need to choose between in, on and at.

on a bag on a balcony on a bicycle (bike), on a motorbike on a bolle on a chair on a door on a farm **on** a horse, **on** an elephant on a page on a planet on a plate on a river on a road on a shelf on a t-shirt on a (the) wall on an island on earth on holiday(s) on my bike/bicycle on my face, on my foot on television, on TV on the ground, on the 4th floor, etc. on the beach on the bus/plane/train/ship **on** the carpet on the ceiling on the coast on the cover on the envelope on the (second) floor on the grass on the leb, on the right on the menu on the page on the radio on the right on the river on the shelf on the sofa on the table on the tree on the wall on the way (to...), on the (my) way home on the way from A to B on the window

in the countryin the gardenin the kitchen

NOTE

1)He worked at the university. I studied math at university. She worked in a hospital. She visited him in hospital.

2)go/come/walk/get/arrive (etc.) home (without 'to') be/stay/do something (etc.) at home

3)go/come/return/walk/get to work/school/university/a party/the airport/Paris/Italy/bed be/stay/do something in London/France/the city center/bed be/stay/do something at work/school/university/a party/the station/her brother's house

4)arrive in a country or town (arrive in Italy / arrive in Paris etc.) arrive at other places (arrive at the station / arrive at the hotel / arrive at work, etc.)

5)I saw her at the cinema. (as a point)

- by the door of the cinema but still in the street,
- inside the cinema, where you have to pay
- right inside where the seats and the screen are

I saw her in the cinema. (as a building)

- inside the cinema, where you have to pay
- right inside where the seats and the screen are
- BUT NOT: 'in the street', unless you're talking about where cars go
