# Comparatives

It's used to compare two things or people.

## **Superiority**

Small adjective: adj + "er"

calm - calm**er** old - old**er** short - short**er**  My dog is calmer than your cat.

That turtle was older than my grandmother. In the past, people used to have shorter lives

than we have now.

Long adjective: more + adj

beautiful - **more** beautiful intelligent - **more** intelligent expensive - **more** expensive

She is more beautiful than me.

Mark is more intelligent than his brother.

Living in RJ is more expensive than living in Porto Alegre.

Adjectives ending in "y": remove "y" + "ier"

happy - happ**ier** I feel happier in the Summer.

funny - funn**ier**Jim Carrey is funnier than Faustão.
lovely - lovel**ier**His dad is lovelier than his mom.

Adjectives ending in Consonant Vowel Consonant: double last consonant + "er"

hot - hot**ter** Salvador is hotter than Florianópolis.

big - big**ger** SP is bigger than Brasília.

thin - thin**ner** This book is thinner than the last one I read.

Irregular adjectives

good - **better**I am better in Maths than in Science.

This movie is worse than its book.

far - **farther** physically distant

I live farther from school than you.

I stopped reading this book, I will not go any

further.

### **Inferiority**

Less + adjective

popular - **less** popular economic - **less** economic deep - **less** deep

further hypothetical distance

John is less popular than Bill.
That car is less economic than mine.
My swimming pool is less deep than the or

My swimming pool is less deep than the one at the club.



## **Equality**

As "adjective" as

careful - **as** careful **as** smart - **as** smart **as** important - **as** important **as**  My mom is as careful as my dad. Mary is as smart as Charles. Nurses are as important as doctors.

## **Emphasize**

much, way, a lot + comparative: big differences a bit, a little, a little bit, slightly + comparative: small differences

Switzerland is much more expensive than Italy. / Switzerland is way more expensive than Italy. / Switzerland is a lot more expensive than Italy. Molly is a bit taller than her sister. / Molly is a little taller than her sister. Molly is a little bit taller than her sister.

# Common mistakes!

#### more and -er

We use more or -er, but we cannot use more + -er.

My brother is taller than me. (NOT My brother is more taller that me.)

#### that

After a comparative adjective, we use than and NOT that. My brother is taller than me. (NOT My brother is taller that me.)

### than without the second element of the comparison

We use than + the second thing that we are comparing. When we don't mention the second element of the comparison, we do NOT use than. *My brother is taller than me.* 

I am tall, but my brother is taller. (NOT my brother is taller than.)
