Som de /ŋ/ no meio de palavras.

anger / 'æŋgər/

EXAMPLE

She was trembling with anger.

length /leŋkθ/

EXAMPLE

Measure the **length** of the line from A to B.

mango / ˈmæŋgəʊ/

EXAMPLE

Mangoes are delicious!

singing / sinjin/

EXAMPLE

The birds were singing.

single / singl/

EXAMPLE

Are you still single?

strongly / stro:nli/

EXAMPLE

I strongly disagree!

angry / 'æŋgri/

EXAMPLE

Why are you son **angry**?



anxious / 'æŋkʃəs/

EXAMPLE

I'm anxious about the meeting.

hunger / hʌŋgər/

EXAMPLE

I felt faint with **hunger**.

wrongly / rɔːŋli/

EXAMPLE

The sentence had been **wrongly** translated.

Som de /ŋ/ no final de palavras.

among /əˈmʌŋ/

EXAMPLE

I found the letter **among** his papers.

long /lɔːŋ/

EXAMPLE

She had **long** dark hair.

morning / moːrnɪŋ/

EXAMPLE

See you tomorrow morning.

ring /rɪŋ/

EXAMPLE

He gave me a beautiful ring.

strong /stro:n/

EXAMPLE

Jack was tall and **strong**.



sing /sin/

EXAMPLE

I can't **sing** very well.

song /soːŋ/

EXAMPLE

We sang a **song** together.

thing /OIŋ/

EXAMPLE

They talked about many **things**, like books, music and films.

working / ws:rkin/

EXAMPLE

The printer isn't working.

wrong /rɔːŋ/

EXAMPLE

It is **wrong** to tell lies.

MINIMAL PAIRS /ŋ/ VS /n/

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sin /sin/ - sing /sin/
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sun /sʌn/ - sung /sʌŋ/

win /win/ - wing /win/

ton /tʌn/ - tongue /tʌŋ/

done /dʌn/ - dung /dʌŋ/

stun /stʌn/ - stung /stʌŋ/
