Os sons de /ɔɪ/ e /eɪ/

OS SONS DA LÍNGUA INGLESA: DITONGOS AULA 24

Ditongo é o encontro de dois sons de vogais que pertencem à mesma sílaba e são pronunciadas numa só emissão de voz. Este é o caso do som de /ɔɪ/ e /eɪ/ como nas palavras abaixo.

SOM DE /ɔɪ/

oil /ɔɪ/

EXAMPLE

Heat the frying pan and add cooking **oil**.

ointment /'ɔɪntmənt/

EXAMPLE

He put some **ointment** on the cut.

oyster /'ɔɪstər/

EXAMPLE

He is eating **oysters**.

boy /bɔɪ/

EXAMPLE

I used to play here as a **boy**.

joy /dʒɔɪ/

EXAMPLE

I almost wept with **joy**.

toy /tɔɪ/

EXAMPLE

The children were playing happily with their **toys**.

voice /vɔɪs/

EXAMPLE

His **voice** sounded familiar.**enjoy /ɪn 'dʒɔɪ/**

EXAMPLE

I hope you **enjoy** your trip.**avoid /ə 'vɔɪd/**

EXAMPLE

We must find a way to **avoid** similar problems in future.**choice /tʃɔɪs/**

EXAMPLE

I am sure you have made the right **choice**.**noise /nɔɪz/**

EXAMPLE

I heard a loud **noise** and turned around.**soil /sɔɪl/**

EXAMPLE

Keep the **soil** moist and fertilize weekly.**spoil /spɔɪl/**

EXAMPLE

Don't let him **spoil** your evening.**annoy /ə 'nɔɪ/**

EXAMPLE

I'm sure she does it just to **annoy** me.**Illinois /ɪlə 'nɔɪ/**

EXAMPLE

She was born in the state of **Illinois**.

employ /ɪmˈplɔɪ/

EXAMPLE

How many people does the company **employ**?**alloy** /ˈælɔɪ/

EXAMPLE

Brass is an **alloy** of copper and zinc.**turmoil** /ˈtɜːrmɔɪl/

EXAMPLE

Her mind was in a state of constant **turmoil**.**join** /dʒɔɪn/

EXAMPLE

Join the two halves together with glue.**coin** /kɔɪn/

EXAMPLE

They flipped a **coin** to see who should go first.**point** /pɔɪnt/

EXAMPLE

There are two key **points** to remember.**SOM DE /eɪ/****ache** /eɪk/

EXAMPLE

My joints **ache**.**age** /eɪdʒ/

EXAMPLE

You're the same **age** as my brother.

eight /eɪt/

EXAMPLE

He's **eight** years old.**aid /eɪd/**

EXAMPLE

This job would be impossible without the **aid** of a computer.**aim /eɪm/**

EXAMPLE

Don't try to **aim** for perfection.**face /feɪs/**

EXAMPLE

The expression on his **face** never changed.**cake /keɪk/**

EXAMPLE

He cut her a slice of **cake**.**brake /breɪk/**

EXAMPLE

My **brakes** are not working properly.**case /keɪs/**

EXAMPLE

The **case** will be heard next week.**game /geɪm/**

EXAMPLE

The children invented a new **game**.**pay /peɪ/**

EXAMPLE

I'll **pay** for the tickets.

today /tə 'deɪ/

EXAMPLE

I've got a piano lesson later **today**.**snake /sneɪk/**

EXAMPLE

There has been an increase in **snake** bite cases.**nature / 'neɪtʃər/**

EXAMPLE

Take time to appreciate the beauties of **nature**.**paper / 'peɪpər/**

EXAMPLE

Make sure you have pen and **paper** handy.**brain /breɪn/**

EXAMPLE

The human **brain** is a complex organ.**chain /tʃeɪn/**

EXAMPLE

She wore a heavy gold **chain** around her neck.**rain /reɪn/**

EXAMPLE

I think I felt a drop of **rain**.**train /treɪn/**

EXAMPLE

The **train** is running late.**explain /ɪk 'spleɪn/**

EXAMPLE

First, I'll **explain** the rules of the game.

ballet /bæ 'leɪ/

EXAMPLE

She wants to be a **ballet** dancer.**buffet** /bʊ 'feɪ/

EXAMPLE

Breakfast is served **buffet** style.**cliché** /kli: 'ʃeɪ/

EXAMPLE

It has become a **cliché** to say that Prague is the most beautiful city in Europe.**fiancé** /,fi:ɑ:n 'seɪ/

EXAMPLE

Linda and her **fiancé** were there.**gourmet** / 'gʊrmeɪ/

EXAMPLE

He is a **gourmet** cook.
