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O som de /θ/ (TH não vozeado) e /ð/ (TH vozeado)

OS SONS DA LÍNGUA INGLESA: CONSOANTES AUI A 04

É comum ouvir falar que o som de TH em inglês seja um dos mais difíceis para falantes de português. Trata-se de um som inexistente na língua portuguesa e, por isso a dificuldade. Porém, não existe um som de TH, mas dois.

O Som de TH não vozeado /0/ é feito com a língua entre os dentes através da passagem de ar sem vibração nas cordas vocais. O som de TH vozeado /0/ assume a mesma posição da língua, também utiliza a passagem de ar entre os dentes, mas causa vibração nas cordas vocais.

Som de /0/ (TH não vozeado) no começo de palavras

think /θɪŋk/

EXAMPLE

I think so.

thanks /θæŋks/

EXAMPLE

Thanks for your advice.

thin /OIn/

EXAMPLE

She's tall and thin.

three /θriː/

EXAMPLE

I see **three** trees in the distance.



thing /OIII/

EXAMPLE

I give thanks for every little thing.

third /θ3:rd/

EXAMPLE

He came in **third** place.

thumb /θ_Λm/

EXAMPLE

How did you cut your **thumb**?

thirty / θ3:rti/

EXAMPLE

They have **thirty** cats.

thirteen / | 03:r ti:n/

EXAMPLE

The bus has **thirteen** seats for passengers.

Thursday / '03:rzde1/

EXAMPLE

They will be here on **Thursday**.

Som de /0/ (TH não vozeado) no meio de palavras

toothpick/'tu:θpik/

EXAMPLE

He used a **toothpick** to clean his teeth.

birthday / b3:rθde1/

EXAMPLE

My **birthday** is on the fourth of December.



heal<u>th</u>y / helθi/

EXAMPLE

We have a very **healthy** diet.

something / samθιη/

EXAMPLE

Do you have **something** to say?

anything / eniθιη/

EXAMPLE

Would you like anything else?

athlete / ˈæθliːt/

EXAMPLE

The **athletes** are training hard for the Olympics.

Som de /0/ (TH não vozeado) no fim de palavras

ma<u>th</u> /mæθ/

EXAMPLE

Math is his favorite subject.

tooth /tuːθ/

EXAMPLE

He had a **tooth** pulled out.

teeth /ti:θ/

EXAMPLE

The baby has no **teeth**.

fifth /frfθ/

EXAMPLE

You're the **fifth** person to ask me that question.



breath /breθ/

EXAMPLE

He seemed a little out of breath.

ear<u>th</u> /3ːrθ/

EXAMPLE

I live on planet earth.

mou<u>th</u> /maʊθ/

EXAMPLE

Don't talk with your **mouth** full!

South /sauθ/

EXAMPLE

They bought a house in the **South** of Germany.

North /norθ/

EXAMPLE

Houses are less expensive in the **North**.

that /ðæt/

EXAMPLE

That is not my problem.

this /ðis/

EXAMPLE

This book is mine.

those /ðoʊz/

EXAMPLE

Can I help you with those bags?



these /ðiːz/

EXAMPLE

What are **these** toys doing here?

they /ðeɪ/

EXAMPLE

They are very nice people.

them /ðem/

EXAMPLE

I don't like them.

their /ðer/

EXAMPLE

He gave them their coats.

there /ðer/

EXAMPLE

There is that book you were looking for.

the /ðə/ ou /ði/

EXAMPLE

Let's go to the movies.

Som de /ð/ (TH vozeado) vozeado no meio de palavras

other / 'Aðər/

EXAMPLE

He's waiting on the **other** side of the street.

another /əˈnʌðər/

EXAMPLE

Would you like another cup of tea?



either / 'iːðər/ ou / 'aɪðər/

EXAMPLE

I left it either at home or in the car.

father / ˈfɑːðər/

EXAMPLE

Tell your **father** I was asking after him.

mother / maðər/

EXAMPLE

That's my **mother**.

brother / braðər/

EXAMPLE

I have just one **brother**.

feather / 'feðər/

EXAMPLE

Where did you find that **feather**?

wea<u>th</u>er / 'weðər/

EXAMPLE

What's the weather like outside?

clothing / klovðin/

EXAMPLE

Please make sure you bring warm clothing.

together /təˈgeðər/

EXAMPLE

We're in this **together**.



Som de /ð/ (TH vozeado) no final de palavras

breathe / bri:ð/

EXAMPLE

Try to **breathe** normally.

loathe /loʊð/

EXAMPLE

They **loathe** each other.

bathe /beɪð/

EXAMPLE

I **bathe** every day.

seethe /siːð/

EXAMPLE

She was **seething** at the insult.

clothe /kloʊð/

EXAMPLE

They have eight kids to feed and clothe.

smooth /smuːð/

EXAMPLE

The baby's skin is so **smooth!**
