### ever / 'evər/

EXAMPLE

### every / 'evri/

**EXAMPLE** 

She knows **every** student in the school.

### any / eni/

EXAMPLE

He asked if we had any questions.

### ebb/eb/

EXAMPLE

They went out to sea with the **ebb**.

### effort / 'efart/

**EXAMPLE** 

The project was a team **effort**.



### episode / episəʊd/

EXAMPLE

The next **episode** has not yet been filmed.

### education / edgu ker n/

**EXAMPLE** 

She went to America to complete her **education**.

### envelope / envələʊp/

EXAMPLE

I put the letter in the wrong **envelope**.

### end /end/

**EXAMPLE** 

I'll never get to the end of this book!

### enter / 'entər/

**EXAMPLE** 

Knock before you enter.

### emanate / 'emanest/

**EXAMPLE** 

He **emanates** power and confidence.

### emperor / empərər/

**EXAMPLE** 

It was under the **emperor** Justinian that these advances were made.

### emphasize / emfəsaɪz/

EXAMPLE

It is important to **emphasize** this point.

### escalator / 'eskəleɪtər/

**EXAMPLE** 

Take the **escalator** down to the lower level.

**EXAMPLE** 

We keep our bikes in the **shed**.

### pet /pet/

**EXAMPLE** 

The apartment we live in doesn't allow **pets** of any kind.

### red /red/

EXAMPLE

The traffic light turned red.

### left /left/

**EXAMPLE** 

Turn **left** at the next corner.

### deck /dek/

**EXAMPLE** 

After dinner we sat out on the deck.

### beg/beg/

EXAMPLE

We went to him to **beg** for forgiveness.

### tell /tel/

**EXAMPLE** 

Did anyone tell you what happened?

### bell /bel/

**EXAMPLE** 

Ring the **bell** to see if they're in.



### sell /sel/

EXAMPLE

It will be hard to sell 3 000 tickets.

### well /wel/

**EXAMPLE** 

The team work well together.

### tech /tek/

EXAMPLE

There has been a huge expansion of business for our **tech** companies.

### west/west/

**EXAMPLE** 

The sun rises in the east and sets in the west.

### lesson / lesn/

**EXAMPLE** 

I'm having driving lessons.

### guest /gest/

**EXAMPLE** 

Liz was not on the **guest** list.

### guess /ges/

**EXAMPLE** 

How old do you think I am? Go on, guess!

### br<u>ea</u>th /breθ/

**EXAMPLE** 

His **breath** smelt of garlic.

### instead /In sted/

EXAMPLE

Walk to work **instead** of going by car.



### said /sed/

EXAMPLE

He said he loves her.

### says /sez/

**EXAMPLE** 

He says he doesn't love her.

### ag<u>ai</u>n /əˈgen/

EXAMPLE

Can we start again, please?

### friend /frend/

**EXAMPLE** 

This is my **friend** Tom.

### head /hed/

**EXAMPLE** 

He shook his **head** in disbelief.

### dead /ded/

**EXAMPLE** 

The poor child looks more **dead** than alive.

### ready / redi/

EXAMPLE

Just a minute—I'm almost ready.

### many / meni/

**EXAMPLE** 

It was one of my many mistakes.
