art /a:rt/

EXAMPLE

He was a noted **art** collector.

article / 'g:rtɪkl/

EXAMPLE

I'm doing an **article** about ways of preventing pollution.

obvious / 'a:bviəs/

EXAMPLE

It is **obvious** to me that you're unhappy in your job.

October /aːk ˈtəʊbər/

EXAMPLE

She was born in October.

opportunity / aːpərˈtuːnəti/

EXAMPLE

Don't miss this **opportunity**!

honest / 'a:nist/

EXAMPLE

Give me your honest opinion.

occupation / a:kju pei n/

EXAMPLE

He gave up his occupation as a farmer and became a teacher.

lock /laːk/

EXAMPLE

Did you lock the door?



stop /sta:p/

EXAMPLE

This train doesn't **stop** at Oxford.

pot /pa:t/

EXAMPLE

Put all the ingredients in a large **pot**.

father / 'faːðər/

EXAMPLE

Mark is now married and **father** to a young son.

hot /ha:t/

EXAMPLE

Do you like this **hot** weather?

clock /kla:k/

EXAMPLE

The **clock** has stopped.

soft /so:ft/

EXAMPLE

The ground was **soft** and dry.

lot /la:t/

EXAMPLE

I still have a **lot** to do.

<u>jo</u>b /dʒaːb/

EXAMPLE

He's trying to get a job.

got /ga:t/

EXAMPLE

Joe's **got** a new pair of glasses.



proper / pra:per/

EXAMPLE

Nothing is in its **proper** place.

knot /na:t/

EXAMPLE

Tie the two ropes together with a **knot**.

sock /saːk/

EXAMPLE

I never wear socks.

rob /ra:b/

EXAMPLE

The bank was **robbed** last year.

honor / 'a:nər/

EXAMPLE

It was a great **honor** to be invited here today.

model / maxdl/

EXAMPLE

She made a fantastic clay **model** of her dog.

possible / pa:səbl/

EXAMPLE

This wouldn't have been **possible** without you.

college / ka:lid3/

EXAMPLE

She wanted to go to **college** to become a nurse.

follow / 'fa:ləʊ/

EXAMPLE

Follow me please.



positive / parzetry/

EXAMPLE

It's always nice to get **positive** feedback.

block /bla:k/

EXAMPLE

The wall was made from massive **blocks** of stone.

bottle / baːtl/

EXAMPLE

She filled the **bottle** with water.

sp<u>a</u> /spa:/

EXAMPLE

The **spa** offers exercise classes.

palm /pa:m/

EXAMPLE

He showed me the coins in his palm.

adopt /ə da:pt/

EXAMPLE

We would like to **adopt** a child.

far /faːr/

EXAMPLE

We didn't go far.

harm /harm/

EXAMPLE

Hard work never did anyone any harm.

start /stairt/

EXAMPLE

We **start** by examining the evidence.



garden / ˈgɑːrdn/

EXAMPLE

They sat in the **garden** and enjoyed the sunshine.

garage /gəˈrɑːdʒ/

EXAMPLE

Did you shut the **garage** door?

common / ka:mən/

EXAMPLE

Allergies to milk are quite **common** in childhood.

contact / kg:ntækt/

EXAMPLE

She's lost contact with her son.

bond /baind/

EXAMPLE

We try to forge **bonds** between the different communities.

blockade /bla: keid/

EXAMPLE

The police set up **blockades** on highways leading out of the city.
