São dois sons que existem na língua portuguesa. Portanto, não há dificuldades para nós brasileiros em produzi-los. No entanto, é importante notar que o som em inglês pode ser descrito no inglês escrito por letras que não descrevem o mesmo som em português. Veremos isso nos exemplos.

1 Som de /ʃ/ no começo de palavras.

shave /ʃeɪv/

EXAMPLE

I didn't have time to **shave** today.

she /ʃi:/

EXAMPLE

She's a dentist.

shin /ʃɪn/

EXAMPLE

I cut my **shin**.

shine /ʃaɪn/

EXAMPLE

The Sun does not **shine** all the time.

ship /ʃɪp/

EXAMPLE

They boarded a **ship** bound for India.

should /ʃʊd/

EXAMPLE

He **should** have been more careful.

show /ʃəʊ/

EXAMPLE

Millions of people watch the **show**.**shower** /'ʃaʊər/

EXAMPLE

He's in the **shower**.**sugar** /'ʃʊgər/

EXAMPLE

This juice contains no added **sugar**.**sure** /ʃʊr/

EXAMPLE

Are you **sure** about that?

2 Som de /ʃ/ no meio de palavras.

creation /kri'eɪʃn/

EXAMPLE

He had been with the company since its **creation**.**fashion** /'fæʃn/

EXAMPLE

Jeans are always in **fashion**.**imagination** /ɪ,mædʒɪ'neɪʃn/

EXAMPLE

He has no **imagination**.**pressure** /'preʃər/

EXAMPLE

I'm under a lot of **pressure** right now.

social /'səʊʃl/

EXAMPLE

She has a busy **social** life.

3 Som de /ʃ/ no final de palavras.

brush /brʌʃ/

EXAMPLE

Did you **brush** your teeth?**English** /'ɪŋɡlɪʃ/

EXAMPLE

I need to improve my **English**.**trash** /træʃ/

EXAMPLE

Don't forget to take out the **trash**.**wash** /wɑːʃ/

EXAMPLE

If you wash the **dishes**, I'll dry.**wish** /wɪʃ/

EXAMPLE

I **wish** I were taller.

4 Som de /ʒ/ no começo e no meio de palavras.

genre /'ʒɑːnrə/

EXAMPLE

Science fiction as a **genre** is relatively new.

casual /'kæʒuəl/

EXAMPLE

He tried to sound **casual**.**confusion** /kən'fju:ʒn/

EXAMPLE

The announcement caused a lot of **confusion**.**decision** /dɪ'sɪʒn/

EXAMPLE

I think I've made the right **decision**.**measure** /'meʒər/

EXAMPLE

It is hard to **measure** the benefits.**occasion** /ə'keɪʒn/

EXAMPLE

I've met him on several **occasions**.**pleasure** /'pleʒər/

EXAMPLE

He beamed with **pleasure** at seeing her.**seizure** /'si:ʒər/

EXAMPLE

He had an epileptic **seizure**.**television** /'telɪvɪʒn/

EXAMPLE

She's always appearing on **television**.**usually** /'ju:ʒuəli/

EXAMPLE

We **usually** go by car.

visual /'vɪʒuəl/

EXAMPLE

I have a very good visual memory.

 Som de /ʒ/ no final de palavras.**beige** /beɪʒ/

EXAMPLE

She was wearing a **beige** dress.**collage** /kə'laɪʒ/

EXAMPLE

It's a photo **collage**.**massage** /mə'sɑ:ʒ/

EXAMPLE

The physiotherapist gave me a **massage**.**mirage** /mə'raɪʒ/

EXAMPLE

It was just a **mirage**.**rouge** /ru:ʒ/

EXAMPLE

She was wearing too much **rouge**.**sabotage** /'sæbətɑ:ʒ/

EXAMPLE

The fire may have been an act of **sabotage**.

MINIMAL PAIRS /ʃ/ E /ʒ/

Aleutian /əˈluːʃn/ - **allusion** /əˈluːʒn/

EXAMPLE

It's an **allusion** to the **Aleutian** Islands.

Confucian /kənˈfjuːʃən/ - **confusion** /kənˈfjuːʒn/

EXAMPLE

The **Confucian** text caused great **confusion**.

ruche /ruːʃ/ - **rouge** /ruːʒ/

EXAMPLE

She was wearing **rouge**, and the corsage was trimmed with a **ruche**.
