## PAST CONTINUOUS OR PAST PROGRESSIVE

## ■ WHEN DO WE USE THE PAST CONTINUOUS?

We use the Past Continuous to talk about things that were happening in the past

\*Past tense of the verb BE (was or were) + -ING form of the verb

#### THE VERB BE IN THE PAST

	was
you, we, they	were
he, she, it	was

#### THE "ING" FORM OF THE VERB

GOING/ EATING/ DOING/ SLEEPING

#### **EXAMPLES:**

- 1. We were sleeping when the phone rang.
- 2. I was taking a shower when you called.
- **3.** The children were playing while I was cleaning the kitchen.
- **4.** While I was studying my husband was cleaning the garage.
- **5.** We were driving home from work when we saw the car accident.
- 6. What were you doing at midnight on New Year's Eve?
- 7. Paul and Sandra were walking their dog when the storm hit.
- 8. The baby wasn't (was not) sleeping when the babysitter arrived.
- 9. Jenny was studying for her English test all day yesterday.
- 10. I was making a birthday cake when the smoke alarm went off.
- Remember, there are some non-action verbs that aren't supposed to be used in the continuous tense.

# REMEMBER, THERE ARE SOME NON-ACTION VERBS THAT AREN'T SUPPOSED TO BE USED IN THE CONTINUOUS TENSE.

#### **AFFIRMATIVE SENTENCES:**

Subject + BE in the past (was/were) + verb-ING

- Ex. Kendal was walking her dog in the park.
- Ex. I was working on my thesis.
- Ex. The kids were playing on the playground.

#### **NEGATIVE SENTENCES:**

Subject + BE in the past (was/were) + not + verb-ING

- Ex. Kendal wasn't walking her dog in the park.
- Ex. I wasn't working on my thesis.
- Ex. The kids weren't playing on the playground.

#### **INTERROGATIVE SENTENCES (QUESTIONS):**

BE in the past (Was/Were) + subject + verb-ING...?

- Ex. Was Kendal walking her dog in the park?
- Ex. Were you working on your thesis?
- Ex. Were the kids playing on the playground?

## **EXAMPLES**

- 1. I was sleeping when you called.
- 2. Peggy broke her leg while she was skiing.
- 3. While I was cooking dinner, the children were playing outside.
- 4. Yesterday while I was looking at my computer screen, I started to feel a little dizzy.
- 5. Peter wasn't studying at the library last night. He and his friends were playing video games.

## **IMPORTANTE**

The gerund, not the infinitive, is used after prepositions.

#### **Examples:**

- I apologized for being late. (Preposition for / Gerund being)
- I'm tired of working so much. (Preposition of / Gerund working)
- Sara forgave Sean for lying. (Preposition for / Gerund lying)
- Are you afraid of making mistakes? (Preposition of / Gerund making)
- The children are good at making messes. (Preposition at / Gerund making)
- Before watching this video, I was eating lunch. (Preposition before/ Gerund watching)



<sup>\*</sup>was + not = wasn't

<sup>\*</sup>were + not = weren't
