Native talks

In this class we'll focus on some expressions taught by Jen and apply it to some different situations.

1. I'm in charge of a Marketing team at a PR firm at the moment.

Eu atualmente sou encarregado(a) de uma equipe de marketing em uma empresa de relações públicas.

- **“In charge of”** means “encarregado” and it is an adjective that can be used before different sectors, like construction/economics/insurance/production management/software development and before projects or activities.
- **“In charge”** without the **“of”** when making sentences without mentioning an object.

2. I found out you were hiring through a Trade Expo.

Eu descobri que vocês estavam contratando através de uma feira de comércio.

- Watch out for the common mistake! The correct and most common way to say “contratar” is **“to hire”**!
- Through - através - I heard about the company through a friend/I found out through LinkedIn.

3. I'm a bit nervous about mediating the conference call. Have you ever done it before?

Eu estou um pouco nervoso a respeito de mediar a conferência por telefone. Você já fez isso antes?

- Phrasal verbs and verbs followed by **“about/with/of”** and other prepositions different from **“to”** make the next verb need **ing** - I'm thinking about moving to a different station.
- **“Have you ever”** - Alguma vez na vida - Sentences with **“have”** as auxiliary refer to the past but express no limit.

4. I committed to a friend's wedding in a few weeks, and I was wondering if I could take a few days off?

Eu prometi ir ao casamento de um amigo daqui a algumas semanas, e gostaria de saber se eu poderia tirar alguns dias de folga.

- ***“Committed to”*** is similar to ***“promised to do something”***.
- Asking politely - Could you/Can you.
- Could I be excused? - Eu poderia ser dispensado?
- I was wondering if - eu estava pensando se/estava me perguntando/gostaria de saber se.
- ***“Days off”*** means days away from work.

5. Would you mind carrying my bags?

Você se importaria em carregar minhas malas?

- **“Would you mind?”** means “Você se importaria?”
- Would you mind explaining again? - the verb after **“do you mind”** needs to have ING.
- An alternative way of using **“please”** is **“Would you please..?”**:
Would you please get me some water?

6. There's a lot more learning to do to gain financial literacy, or knowledge on how to handle your personal finances.

Há muito mais a se aprender para adquirir educação financeira, ou conhecimento sobre como lidar com as suas finanças pessoais

- **“There is”** is used for singular objects and **“there are”** is for objects in plural form.
- Ing + to do - Learning to do - Reading to do - Studying to do - catching up to do. - You have a lot of reading to do before you use the new interface. It means “a se fazer”.
- How to handle a new position - How to handle the pressure - How to handle your team. The verb **“handle”** means “lidar com/ dar conta de”.
- **“Knowledge on”** and **“knowledge about”** have a very similar meaning.
