Let's remember some structures and some useful language from our dialogue and Business in Focus classes!

#### 1. It sounds like you've thought this through.

Parece que você pensou bem nisso.

#### 1.1 Management knows we can achieve that.

A gerência sabe que a gente consegue alcançar aquilo.

- "Sounds like", "Looks like", "acts like" are used to refer to impressions and similarities.
- "Thought this through" expression used with "think" Other uses
  of the word "through" refer to physical movements or manual
  activities. "I've gone through the plan", "He walked through the
  door".
- Alternative "You have a plan".
- Present simple: general truths and facts, regular and habitual events, instructions, directions, stories, immediate action, recurrent schedules and decided plans.

## 2. We've been putting a lot of effort into safety training.

Temos colocado bastante esforço em treinamento de segurança.

- "Put effort into" Uses of the word "effort" attempts, combined effort, special effort, with much effort, not worth the effort, effort awards.
- "Into" is different from "to". "Turn into/change into/run into/rush into" movements and alterations.
- "Have been" used to talk about continuous actions or situations that began in the near past. "The meetings have been helpful".

## 3. It <u>would</u> help us all if you shared your experience.

Ajudaria a todos nós se você compartilhasse sua experiência.

- Second conditional would + if + verb in past tense.
- "Help" verb needs to be accompanied by "who" will be helped.
- Would uses: intentions from the point of view of the past, an imagined situation, polite requests and offers. "I would help you if you stopped running around!", "She would come if she wasn't sick."

## 4. I think we might see some pretty big changes around the office.

Eu acho que talvez a gente veja algumas mudanças bem grandes no escritório.

#### 4.1 It might be a good idea to set up a template of your own.

Pode ser uma boa ideia criar seu próprio modelo.

- Might: used to say that something can possibly happen, or happened in the past, without certainty. "We might need to redo this", "I might have forgotten to turn it off".
- Pretty big: in British English would be "quite big".
- Other ways to say "I think": In my opinion, from my point of view, from my standpoint, the way I see it.

### 5. It's not going to be easy, but I can't wait to get to work!

Não vai ser fácil, mas eu mal posso esperar para começar a trabalhar!

- Going to: plans, intentions and expectancies for the future.
- "Can't wait" and other variations: eager, excited.
- "Get to" used as "start" doing something/"arrive" at a point or a place. "We need to get to the next step", "What time are you going to get there?" "We finally got to the airport."
- "Get to" as "have the opportunity to": "He doesn't get to participate in our meetings"
